## **Book Club Meeting Template**

(Using the Apostle's Creed by Al Mohler):

- 1. Welcome and recap of the previous week
- 2. Reading discussion of assigned chapter(s) [Ch. 7: "He was crucified, dead, and buried"]
  - a. What did you find that was helpful?
  - b. What did you find confusing?
  - c. Was there a spot where you disagreed with the author?
- 3. Targeted questions on atonement and Jesus's death (if not addressed by students already)
  - a. Why did Jesus die? Answer: to save sinners
  - b.HOW does Jesus's death make salvation possible? Answer: taking the wrath of a holy God as a sinless human.
  - c. Why is it necessary? Answer: corrupted humans could never produce a perfect, eternal sacrifice on their own.
- 4. Teaching discussion points to help explain previous questions as needed:
  - a. What are the most common theories of the Atonement?
  - b. What are the common atonement themes in Scripture?
  - c. What is the ultimate goal of salvation?
- 5. Why does this book/topic matter for us today?
  - a. How does it help us better understand the gospel better?
  - b. How does it lead us to worship?
  - c. How does it help us address cultural issues/false teachings?
